From the Pastor's Desk

Who we are as United Methodists changes on July 1 as we become the Upper New York Conference of the United Methodist Church. At the uniting session, held in Syracuse on June 19, representatives from the NY portions of Troy and Wyoming Conferences, along with the Western New York and North Central New York Conferences

approved a plan of union to create the new conference. As new and exciting as it was, it had been in the works since October 6, 2007, when the idea of a new conference and changes for Vermont and Pennsylvania were approved by simultaneous sessions of the conferences occurred. There were some minor changes to the vision statement and a challenge to the name. The name challenge was interesting. There were some who wanted to use an historic name for the new conference: Genesee, the name of the first conference that emerged in the Northeast of the United States and included most of the conference area. Another suggestion put to the floor was "Living Waters" and then an alternate of "Flowing Waters". Wise people spoke about how all of these names were appropriate for the new conference. However, the overriding concern was not about how our needs were met by a particular name for the conference, but how others looking to participate might be included by a name that is descriptive over symbolic.

In the end, the name was decided as "Upper New York Conference, and the plan of union and its supporting documents were affirmed. A large service of ordination followed.

This was a reminder for us that our structure as a church is a means, a way of doing things, not an end. The end is the mission and ministry that is accomplished in the name of Jesus Christ, by the Holy Spirit. I believe this is why we can celebrate the Upper New York Conference.

With the new conference comes a new bishop for us, Bishop Marcus Matthews. His focus will solely be the Upper New York Area, which is the Upper New York Conference.

940 churches. 12 districts. 48,000 square miles. 198,000 members. That is the new Upper New York Annual Conference.

I hope you will continue to pray for the new conference as it lives into the future. The next session is an adjourned session here in Albany at the Egg on September 11, 2010.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

For thirteen years, from 1925 until June 1938, the Calvary congregation worshiped in a basement! In 1924, members agreed to raise \$3000.00 to build a basement for a new church. The next year, the men of the congregation excavated the basement by hand and it was roofed over and made available for worship, while the Union Chapel next door continued as the Sunday School.

Throughout the years of the Depression, Calvary maintained the dream of a completed church building, slowly raising funds until enough money was available to complete the church structure which was dedicated June 26, 1938. This building remained in use until the current sanctuary was built in 1966. At that time the old building was sold to the Masons, who continue to use it today.
